

- In 2002, there were over 37,700 minority firms in the Orlando-The Villages, FL-Combined Statistical Area (CSA).
- These firms generated over \$5.3 billion in gross receipts and employed over 36,700 paid workers.
- Minority firms represented 24.5 percent of all U.S. firms located in the Orlando-The Villages, FL-CSA in 2002.
- The Orlando-The Villages, FL-CSA includes the Orlando, FL Metropolitan Statistical Area and The Villages, FL Micropolitan Statistical Area.


**Change in Number of Firms and Gross Receipts for Firms in Orlando, FL
 1997 - 2002**



- The number of minority firms in Orlando, FL increased by 41% between 1997 and 2002, compared to a 15% increase for all U.S. firms during the same period.
- Gross receipts generated by minority firms grew by 64% compared to a 47% increase for those generated by all U.S. firms.
- The number of African American firms increased by 56% but their gross receipts decreased by 15%.
- The number of Hispanic firms grew by 80% and their gross receipts by an outstanding 216%.
- Firms owned by Asian, Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islanders declined in number by 38% but their receipts increased by 13%.

Growth trends for the Orlando-The Villages, FL-CSA are not represented because 1997 and 2002 data for the same related counties are not available. Growth in number of firms and gross receipts for Minority Firms and Asian, Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander firms between 1997 and 2002 represent MBDA estimates. Due to the exclusion of tribally held governments in 2002, data for American Indian and Alaska Native firms for 1997 and 2002 are not directly comparable.

Representation of Minority Firms in the Orlando-The Villages, FL-CSA, by Industry – 2002



- In 2002, minority-owned firms in the Orlando-The Villages, FL-CSA were more concentrated in the following industries: other services (18.1%); health care and social assistance (12.1%); and administrative support, waste management, and remediation services (11.7%).
- There were 6,816 firms in other services; 4,575 firms in health care and social assistance; and 4,413 firms in administrative support, waste management, and remediation services.
