

Quick Facts

- There are 3.23 million African American-owned firms in the U.S. Of those, slightly more than 124 thousand are firms with paid employees.
- African American-owned employer firms contribute \$128 billion in U.S. economic output and 1.18 million jobs.
- Employer firms owned by African Americans average 9 workers and \$1.02 million in annual receipts.
- 35% of all African American firms are owned by women and 56% of firms are owned by men.

ACHIEVING ENTREPRENEURIAL PARITY OFFERS GREATER ECONOMIC IMPACT

Our calculations of entrepreneurial parity* predict minority business enterprise performance if it were to match non-minority business performance. The difference between actual and parity can be viewed as an "opportunity gap."



INDUSTRY SECTORS OF ALL AFRICAN AMERICAN-OWNED FIRMS


- Transportation and Warehousing

- 20% of all African American-owned firms are within the Transportation and warehousing sector.
- African American-owned firms are least concentrated in the Real Estate, Educational services, Accommodation and food services and Finance and insurance sectors.
