



Parity²:

In the St. Louis, MO-IL MSA, the Asian & Pacific Islander and the American Indian & Alaska Native groups have achieved parity, in terms of population size and business ownership. In terms of population size and annual receipts, no groups have achieved parity. (See below chart).



² Parity is defined as the proportionality between the population percentage and the percent share of number of firms owned by the group.

Business Participation Rate (BPR) is the number of business owners in a specific race/ethnic group for every 1,000 persons in that same group
