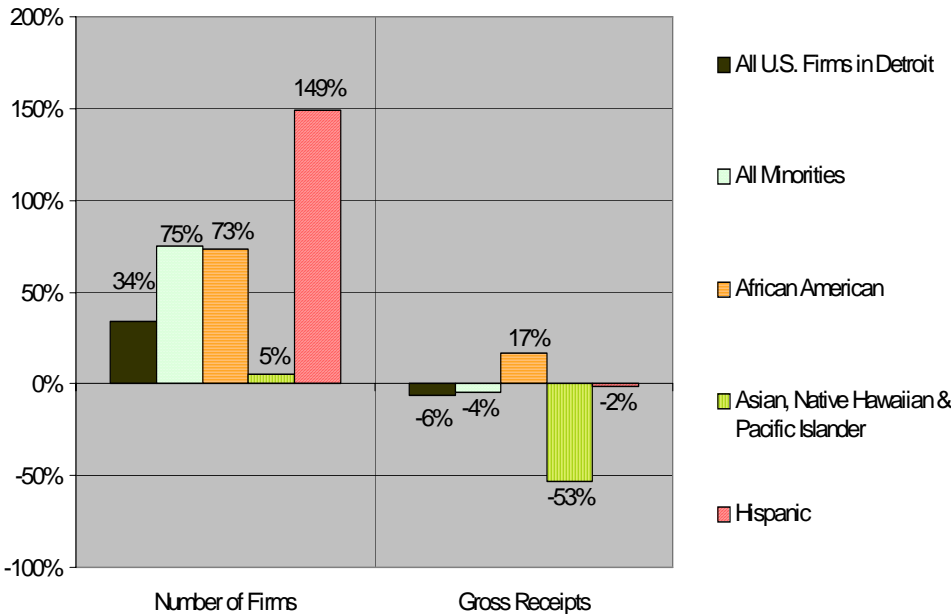

- In 2002, there were over 54,500 minority-owned firms in the Detroit-Warren-Flint, Michigan Combined Statistical Area (CSA).
- Minority firms generated nearly \$10.4 billion in annual gross receipts and employed between 50,000 and 99,999 workers.
- Minority firms represented 14.1 percent of all U.S. firms located in the Detroit-Warren-Flint CSA in 2002.
- The Detroit-Warren-Flint CSA included statistics for the Ann Arbor Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA); the Detroit-Warren-Livonia MSA; Flint MSA, and the Monroe MSA.

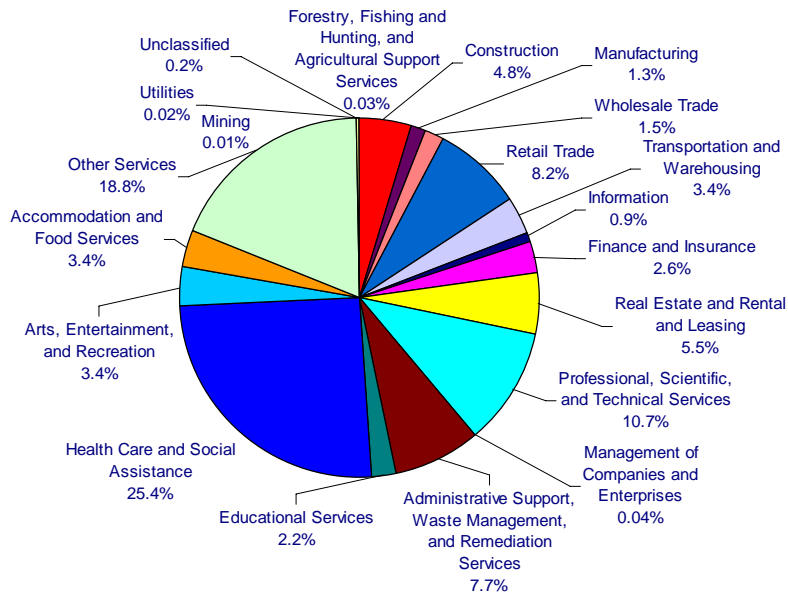
Change in Number of Firms and Gross Receipts for Firms in Detroit, MI - 1997 - 2002



- The number of minority firms in Detroit, MI increased by 75% between 1997 and 2002, compared to a 34% increase for all U.S. firms during the same period.
- However, gross profits for minority firms declined by 4% and those of all U.S. firms fell even further by 6% between 1997 and 2002.
- The number of African American firms increased by 73% and their gross receipts by 17% between 1997 and 2002.
- Gross receipts of Hispanic firms decreased by 2%, despite a 149% increase in the number of Hispanic firms.

Growth in number of firms and gross receipts for Minority Firms and Asian, Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander firms between 1997 and 2002 represent MBDA's estimates. Due to the exclusion of tribally held governments in 2002, data for American Indian and Alaska Native firms for 1997 and 2002 are not directly comparable.

Representation of Minority Firms in Detroit-Warren-Flint, MI - CSA, by Industry – 2002



- In 2002, minority-owned firms in the Detroit-Warren-Flint CSA were more concentrated in the following industries: health care and social assistance (25.4%); other services (18.8%); and professional, scientific, and technical services (10.7%).
- There were over 13,800 firms in health care and social assistance; more than 10,200 firms in other services; and nearly 5,900 firms in professional, scientific, and technical services.
